

Guidelines for selling Admission Tickets to ScoutTrek 2010

Northwest Suburban Council's 100th Anniversary of Scouting Celebration

September 25, 2010

The NWSC Council ScoutTrek 2010 Committee has been busy planning a grand event to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of Scouting. The event will be open to all Scouts, Scouters, families, friends, and the public. To finance this event, the committee is asking all Scouts and Scouters to help promote the event by selling admission tickets between now and the day of the event, Saturday, September 25, 2010. The asking donation amount for the tickets has been set at low reasonable rates in order to be affordable for all to participate, and to make it easy to sell. We are encouraging all Scouts and Scouters to sell at least one book of ten tickets. You may sell tickets to families, friends, businesses, neighbors and the public. Cash, checks and completed ticket stubs should be turned in to unit treasurers when a complete book of ten tickets is sold, or may be dropped off at the council office during normal business hours. Cash can be deposited into unit bank accounts and converted to a single unit check when receipts are turned into the council office, or at your District monthly Roundtable meeting. When turning in funds, be sure to receive a receipt stating funds are for ScoutTrek 2010. All deposited funds must be reconciled with completed ticket stubs. It is important that funds and ticket stubs be deposited with the council office as soon as possible. All completed books of ticket stubs will be placed into a monthly raffle for special prizes to be given out every month beginning with May 2010. Please do not separate the book of ticket stubs. Scouts are encouraged to sell more than one book of tickets to increase their chances of winning more prizes. Any Scout selling 5 books of tickets will receive free admission for himself and his immediate family. If a Non-Scouts or businesses that wish to buy a complete book of tickets, please charge \$10 per ticket, or \$100 for a full book. If a Scout/Scouter wishes to buy a complete book, it is \$50. Mark the price collected on each ticket and they can be given away as donations.

The Admissions tickets entitles the person, or family free shuttle bus service from Woodfield Mall parking lot, a Commemorative Patch for each person, and other give a ways yet to be determined. This is Rain or Shine event, but the forecast is a beautiful warm sunshine Fall day, so come out and enjoy the festivities!

We would like all Scouts, families, and the public to attend this special event. Please give every Scout and family the opportunity to attend by promoting this event at every

weekly and monthly unit meeting up until the day of the event. Tickets can also be purchased at the NWSC Office.
